There have been no changes to goods and ornaments at the Parish Church during 2018.

The work on the church roof was completed within the timescale despite a heavy fall of snow just at the point when the tiles had been removed. Some other repairs identified in the most recent Quinquennial inspection were addressed at the same time and those remaining are in the process of being addressed.

The work on the revised CMC extension began in earnest in July and was completed by February 16th 2019.
